On behalf of the Bar Harbor Chamber of Commerce, I would like to thank the Town of Bar Harbor, the Town Council members, and the citizens of Bar Harbor for supporting the annual July 4<sup>th</sup> and Village Holidays & Midnight Madness events coordinated by the Chamber.

Last year, the Town of Bar Harbor provided \$15,000.00 for the July 4<sup>th</sup> parade and fireworks display in support of this great town event. **Jesup Memorial Library**  
Information for 2021FY Budget Request

The Jesup Memorial Library is a private nonprofit organization, which continues to serve the Town as its free-access public library since 1911. While in many communities the library is a municipal department, fully funded by the local government, our funding comes from many sources. This is the projected breakdown for our 2020 operating revenue: annual donations - 41%, earned – 2.3% , reserve/endowment/trusts – 28.3%, and Town of Bar Harbor – 28.3%. In 2019 the Town contributed \$27.81 per capita toward library service.

We have almost 4,900 card holders, including more than 4,000 with Bar Harbor addresses, about 750 from elsewhere on the island, and the remainder from off-island. About 60,000 people came into the library during 2019. In addition, many people, both residents and visitors, use library services such as the computers or WiFi without being registered borrowers. The quality of our programming for adults is considered among the best in the state, and the attendance is sixth highest among all public libraries.
